2.1 HEALTH INSURANCE

INTERNATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE WITH MAJOR COVERAGE MUST INCLUDE, BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- Medical benefits of at least USD \$100,000 per accident.
- Medical expenses copayment of no more than 25%.
- Medical assistance for COVID-19 included in medical expenses per illness.
